From the Mayor and Council

Welcome to the Town of Capitol Heights. I know that, as a new resident, you will enjoy exploring all that the Town of Capitol Heights has to offer. The Town is located in Prince George's County, Maryland bordering the Nation's Capital Washington, DC, and is one of 27 incorporated municipalities in the state of Maryland. The Town of Capitol Heights boasts "green" open spaces alongside well-tended subdivisions and vibrant, comfortable living areas.

According to the 2010 US Census, there were 4,337 people, 1,482 households and 1,040 families residing in the town. The population density is 5,421.3 inhabitants per square mile. There are 1,622 housing units at an average density of 2,027.5 per square mile. The racial makeup of the town is 3.3% White, 91.3% African American, 0.3% Native American, 0.1% Asian, 3.1% from other races, and 1.9% from two or more races. Hispanic or Latino of any race account for 5.4% of the population.

The Town of Capitol Heights, Maryland maintains a hometown feel while providing the advantages of being in close proximity to Washington DC, and Virginia. A variety of employment prospects and the service of Capitol Heights Elementary School, and six (6) feeder schools serving K-4 through 12th grade makes the Town of Capitol Heights a perfect place for individuals and families.

This informational packet will provide you with an initial introduction to our dynamic community, but I hope you continue to explore the Town of Capitol Heights as you get better acquainted. Libraries

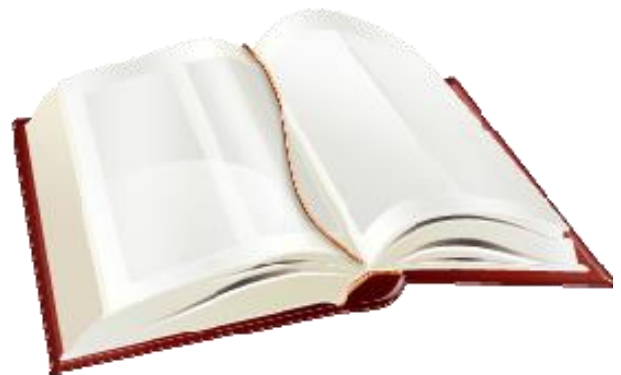

Licenses & Permits

Building Permits

Home construction projects on private property require Town-issued building permits and in most cases a Prince George's County Building Permit. These projects include, but are not limited to, porches, garages, swimming pools, fireplaces, decks, fences and roof, stair and siding replacement. **A permit must be obtained before the start of the project.** Building permits are required for most work on both residential and commercial buildings and structures. Below is a list of the most common work that requires permits from the Town of Capitol Heights:

- Additions
- Alterations or Renovations
- Deck, Patio or Porch
- Fencing
- HVAC Systems
- Roofing
- Roof Mounted Solar Panels
- Plumbing
- Electrical

No permits are needed for the following work:

- Carpet, vinyl and ceramic tile flooring installation.
- Painting, paneling over existing walls and wallpapering.
- Ordinary minor repairs, done in kind.
- Shed – less than 500 square feet



A permit must be obtained before the start of the project.

Permits from Prince George’s County and any other corresponding utility permits must first be obtained prior to obtaining a permit from The Town of Capitol Heights.

The Town of Capitol Heights requires a separate permit, issued by the Town of Capitol Heights, for all work being performed within the incorporated Town of Capitol Heights, congruently and in conjunction with permits that are required by Prince George’s County for a property owner or his/her authorized agent to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, move, improve, remove, connect, demolish or raze any building or structure, change an exit, or alter/install any equipment regulated by the Prince George’s County Building Code. *(See Prince George’s County Department of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement – DPIE <https://www.princegeorgescountymd.gov/1501/Residential-Building>),* as well as, any utility permits required from (PEPCO, Washington Gas and/or Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – WSSC). This requirement is for both residential and commercial property, land, and lots within the incorporated Town of Capitol Heights.

An inspection for underground utilities is required before digging on private property. Residents must call Miss Utility at 1-800-257-777 or 811



Rental License

All homeowners who rent their residences are required to obtain a rental license. The cost of the license is **\$250**. You may download the rental license application from the Town website at www.capitolheightsmd.com/forms or apply at the Town Hall. Rental License must be obtained before renting the property. Additional fees may apply.

Business License

All business owners are required to obtain a Town business license. The cost is **\$375** for the first year and is based on the gross receipts thereafter. Applicants must have a Use & Occupancy Permit from Prince George's County or proof they have applied for one. You may download the business license application from the Town website at www.capitolheightsmd.com/forms or apply at the Town Hall. Additional documents, based on the type of business you operate, may be required.



Yard Maintenance Standards

Yard maintenance pertains to any untended growth in excess of 12 inches in height. Please remember to remove any dead limbs and branches from your property and avoid the over growth of weeds.

Junk, Trash & Debris

Junk, trash and debris are prohibited from being left in the yard and must be disposed of properly. This includes, but is not limited to, junk, auto parts, appliances, furniture, building materials, tires, trash such as discarded paper, cardboard, plastics, etc., and debris such as tree trimmings and fallen limbs. For Bulk Trash pickup on Wednesdays, call Bates Trucking at (301) 773-2069.

Open Storage

Open storage is prohibited. Generally, any equipment, materials or furnishings that would ordinarily not be used outdoors may not be stored outdoors. For example, you may not keep indoor furniture, household appliances, auto parts or building materials outside.

Minimum Housing Standards

All wood, siding, shingles, roof covering, railings, walls, ceilings, porches, doors, windows, screens and any other exterior parts of residential structures must be maintained in weather-tight, rodent proof, sound condition and in good repair. Interior walls, ceilings, floors, doors and hardware must be in sound condition and in good repair. Electrical, heating and plumbing fixtures shall be installed in accordance with codes and maintained in good and safe repair.

Derelict/Inoperable Vehicles

Derelict/inoperable vehicles cannot be stored except in a fully enclosed, legally constructed building. A derelict/inoperable vehicle is one that does not display a current license tag and/or is not equipped with all parts required to legally and safely operate on public streets and/or cannot be driven under its own power.

Animals

Unrestrained dogs and nuisance animals shall be taken by the police, animal control, officers, or humane officers and impounded in an animal shelter and there confined in a humane manner. No person owning, keeping, or having custody to an animal, except a seeing eye dog, in the Town of Capitol Heights, shall allow or permit excrement from such animal to remain in any public place, nor shall any person permit excrement from such animal to remain on private property without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof.



Neighborhood Services

Town of Capitol Heights Snow Plowing

During a snowstorm, crews concentrate on clearing the primary thorough-fares, highly-traveled intersections and “trouble spots” first. Roads such as Capitol Heights Blvd, Old Central Ave, Chambers and Davey are prioritized. Crews will then plow the roads leading in and out of the neighborhoods and then all cul-de-sacs and side streets..

Parking Restrictions During Winter Months

Winter parking regulations help the Neighborhood Services staff effectively remove snow from the roads and streets by keeping the pavements free of parked cars. This extra room provides the space needed by the plow trucks to maneuver and push snow off the streets.

- Residents are encouraged to park in driveways and on the designated parking side of the street during snow emergencies. Regular on-street parking may resume when the snowfall has stopped and Town of Capitol Heights crews have completely removed the snow to the curb.
- *Residents and businesses should not plow driveway or parking lot snow onto roadways.*

Sidewalk and Fire Hydrant Snow Removal

You are required to remove snow from your sidewalk within 48hours after the precipitation has stopped. Residents are urged to clear snow and ice from the sidewalks in front of their homes to allow neighbors and children en route to school to walk safely away from the street immediately. Residents with fire hydrants in front of their homes are also urged to clear snow and ice away from the hydrants so they are visible and easily accessible for emergency operations.

Water

The Town of Capitol Heights' water comes from Anacostia River and Chesapeake Bay. The water treatment is conducted by the Washington Suburban Sanitation Commission (WSSC) and certified by the Environmental Protection Agency and the Army Corps of Engineers.

Residents are billed quarterly for water usage by WSSC.

Water use restrictions

No person shall allow a continuous stream of water from the Town of Capitol Heights water supply to run off into any gutter, ditch, drain, street inlet, or onto adjacent property while using water for any purpose.





Waste and Recycling

Refuse collection for the Town of Capitol Heights is provided by Bates Trucking. **Refuse is collected on Tuesday and Friday. Bulk trash is collected on Wednesday. Please contact Bates Trash Service prior to 2:00 pm on the Tuesday before pickup to schedule. (301) 773-2069.** Recycling is also collected on Wednesday. Trash may only be left out in a place easily acceptable for the trash collector after 6:00 PM on the day proceeding collection. It must be returned to the rear or side of your premises by 10:00 AM the day following collection. We thank you for your assistance in keeping the Town of Capitol Heights beautiful.

Yard Waste Pick-Up

Yard waste is picked up on Wednesdays by Bates Trash Service. Yard waste must be in a paper receptacle or a trash receptacle which has been labeled yard waste. Yard waste in plastic bags (trash bags) will not be serviced and are subject to a county fine. Collection times during holidays

There is no collection on Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day or Labor Day. For removal of Christmas trees, call Bates Trucking at (301) 773-2069.

Introducing the Town of Capitol Heights

Ethics Commission



The Town of Capitol Heights Ethics Commission is an important public service. As a municipality, the Town of Capitol Heights is bound by the Maryland Public Ethics Law that requires all municipalities to have an Ethics Commission that is set up by Ordinance (a Town Law). The Town Council adopted Ordinance 2018-13 that has set up a standing Town Ethics Commission.

The Capitol Heights Ethics Commission is a three-member body. The body is responsible for issuing advisory opinions to the Town Mayor & Council about the acts of Town officials that have been provided to the Commission for review. This is an important part of the fair and ethical administration of town business.

Duties Include:

The Ethics Commission is the advisory body responsible for interpreting per the Town Charter, the Ethics Article. In fulfilling this charge, the Commission will perform the following duties:

- Annual review of Financial Disclosure Forms completed by the Town elected officials and employees.
- To hear and decide with the advice of the Town Attorney, all complaints filed regarding alleged violations of the Ethics Ordinance by any person.
- Annual certification to the State of Maryland Ethics Commission noting the Town of Capitol Heights is in compliance with the requirements for elected officials in accordance with the Annotated Code of Maryland. The Town Administrator will ensure the certification is filed.
- Issue Advisory Opinions regarding application of the Ethics Ordinance.
- Address Ethics Complaints received from the public.
- Recommend legislative changes and improvements to the Ordinance.
